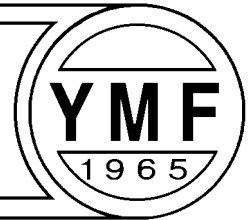

**Subject: 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Sacramento ASCE Charity Golf Tournament**

It is with great pleasure that we invite you, your co-workers, and your guests to the eleventh annual ASCE Charity Golf Tournament. This year's tournament will be held **Monday, July 13, 2009, at Catta Verdera Country Club** in Lincoln. This half-day event includes lunch, a scramble format tournament, and dinner. It's a great opportunity to golf, meet others in the engineering and construction community, and support the local chapter of Make-A-Wish. As in previous years, the net proceeds will go to support the local chapter of the Make-A-Wish Foundation ([www.makeawish-sacto.org](http://www.makeawish-sacto.org)), granting wishes for local children between the ages of 2 ½ and 18 with life threatening medical conditions.

**Last year's tournament once again sold out, so register early to ensure a spot in this event.** We look forward to having you as a sponsor and seeing you at the tournament.

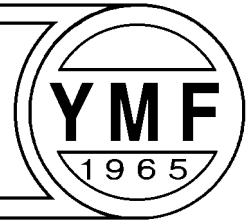
